In 2007, with much prayer we ventured into foster care. It began with the construction of 22 homes and a community center on the east side of Seattle. We now have a thriving foster care program and child placing agency.

The Rose Hill Cottages & Aaron Haskins Community Center stand as a testament to the faith, love and heart of service of many people. City Ministries Child Placement Agency is doing case management, recruitment and training of foster parents, and maintains partnerships with DSHS and other community organizations to help provide a safety net for the rescue and protection of children.


